

Biltmore/Wine Tasting/King Tut Day Wednesday

0730: Depart Maggie Valley.

0820: Arrive at Biltmore Estate.

0900 - 1300: Explore the Biltmore House and Gardens

1300 - 1400: Lunch at the winery and wine tasting

1400 - 1630: Tour King Tut Exhibition

1700: Depart to return to Maggie Valley

Hiking:

1. **Soco Falls** – A short, 0.2 mile easy hike to a stunning double waterfall; can be slippery (5.7 Miles from Maggie Valley)
2. **Cataloochee Valley** – Moderate hikes with historic buildings and elk viewing. Multiple trails, ranging from 1 to 7 miles; moderate difficulty.
3. **Great Smoky Mountains National Park** – Offers trails ranging from easy walks to strenuous hikes.
4. **Blue Ridge Parkway** – Scenic overlooks with short hikes.
5. **Mingo Falls** – A steep but short 0.4 mile hike to a breathtaking waterfall. Moderate difficulty. (23.2 Miles from Maggie Valley)
6. **Deep Creek Trail** – Easy to moderate trails with waterfalls and tubing options. 2.4 miles round trip; easy to moderate.
7. **Pisgah National Forest** – Various trails for hiking and horseback riding.
8. **Waterrock Knob** – A 1.2 mile steep but rewarding hike with panoramic views. Strenuous.
9. **Max Patch** – A 1.7 mile moderate hike loop to a bald mountain with 360-degree views. Moderate difficulty.
10. **Clingmans Dome** – A short 0.5 mile paved trail to an observation tower. The highest point in the Smokies. Steep but short. (42 Miles from Maggie Valley)
11. **Little Cataloochee Trail** – A historic hiking trail with old cabins and churches. 6 miles round trip; moderate difficulty.
12. **Big Creek Trail** – A scenic hike with waterfalls and swimming holes. 4 miles round trip; moderate difficulty.
13. **Cherokee Botanical Garden and Nature Trail** – A peaceful walk through native plants.
14. **Hemphill Bald Trail** – A beautiful horseback riding and hiking trail with stunning views. 9 miles round trip; moderate to strenuous.
15. **Deep Creek Trail** -- A 2.5-mile loop trail featuring three waterfalls: Juneywhank Falls, Tom Branch Falls, and Indian Creek Falls.
